CANDON CITY MUSEUM

San Antonio, Candon City

Initially a residence house, it was said to be as old as the San Juan de Sahagun Church which makes it, or a portion of it, more than 400 years old. Found here are the known artifacts, collections, and objects like the wooden seal of the short-lived Republic of Candon.

HERITAGE SITES

SAINT JOHN DE SAHAGUN PARISH CHURCH

Burgos, Candon City

It is locally known as Candon Church. Constructed with a Baroque design, the church's four-story octagonal bell tower has an alternating open and blind apertures and a balustrade, and it is topped by a campanile.

PLAZAS

HEROES' PARK PLAZA

National Highway, Candon City

It is where the locals hang out and where three of the monuments of Candon City are found, namely Sakada Monument, Isabelo Abaya Monument, and Father Burgos Monument. Also found here is the Candon Fountain where you can enjoy a small-scale water dancing show.



This is where you can see another symbolic attraction in Candon which is the sculpture of the Holy Family carved from an old tree that was damaged due to typhoon Lando. This represents how religious the Candonians are.



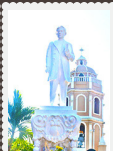
PLAZA WAYA-WAYA

San Juan, Candon City

Just around 10 meters away from the Heroes' Park Plaza is the Plaza Waya-Waya where the monument of Dr. Jose Rizal is situated. The word "waya" means independence, and it is a historic place where the Philippine flag was raised when the Japanese were forced out of the City.



MONUMENTS



ISABELO ABAYA MONUMENT

Heroes' Park Plaza

This bronze-cast historical monument was dedicated to the revolutionary leader, martyr of the Philippine-American War, and local hero - Don Isabelo Abaya. It serves as a reminder of Candon as a part of the history of Philippine Independence.

GABRIELA SILANG MONUMENT

Diversion Road and Museum

This commemorates the renowned Filipino heroine, Gabriela Cariño Silang, who was the leader of the Ilocano independent movement against the Spanish. There is also another monument of the heroine located at the Candon City Museum that used to be her dwelling place during those times.

GREGORIO DEL PILAR MONUMENT

Diversion Road

This monument honors Gregorio del Pilar who headed the Battle of Tirad during the Philippine-American War that led to his heroic death in 1899. Candon City was the starting point of travel to Tirad Pass, and this was to delay the Americans and give time to Emilio Aguinaldo to retreat.

RIZAL MONUMENT

Plaza Waya-Waya

It commemorates the inspiration of nationalist movement, Dr. Jose Rizal, whose works had contributed to the rise of revolution in the Philippines during the Spanish period that led to his execution in Bagumbayan, Manila in 1896.

FATHER BURGOS MONUMENT

Heroes' Park Plaza and Diversion Road

These are dedicated to one of the Filipino martyr priests, Father Jose Burgos, who was born on February 9, 1837 in Gabor, Candon, Ilocos Sur. Along with the two other priests, Father Gomez and Father Zamora, he was executed on February 17, 1872 at Bagumbayan, Manila for sedition and treason.

SAKADA MONUMENT

Heroes' Park Plaza

It is a life-sized bronze-cast statue of a man depicting a Sakada worker representing the fifteen forefathers of the locals who were the first migrants and worked at the sugarcane and pineapple plantations in Hawaii a hundred years ago. It is a symbol of hard work and dignity in labor, paying tribute to the sacrifices of the thousands of Ilocano farmhands who left family and home to work thousands of miles away.

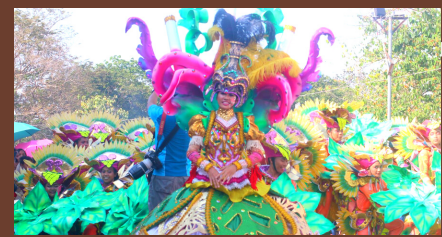
DID YOU KNOW?

FESTIVALS

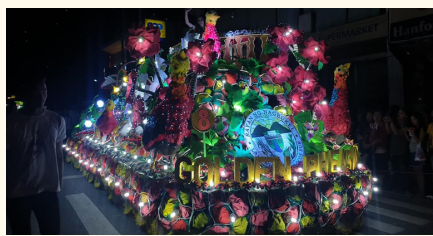
IKKIS TI CANDON FESTIVAL Every Month of March

This is how Candonians celebrate their festivals every 25th of March in honor to the uprising led by Don Isabelo Abaya against the Spaniards on the same date in 1898. It is in this celebration where the Candonians celebrate the Tobacco Festival that promotes the tobacco in the city.



FERIA DE CANDON Every Month of December

It is celebrated in the first week of December as it commemorates the first exposition in Candon way back 1892 which was the first trade exhibit displayed in Ilocos Sur. It features the One-Town-One-Product (OTOP) brand of Ilocos Sur where it is highlighted in the events such as the grandeur of "Parade of Lights" and "Trade Fair".



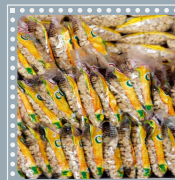
